Tuesday, October 11, 2022
Dr. Lonnie Thompson and Dr. Ellen Mosley-Thompson
"Icy Secrets and Retreating Glaciers Past, Present and Future Societal Impacts."

The Thompsons will discuss their world-renowned research on climate change, which they pioneered at The Ohio State University in the early 70s

and continue today. By drilling and studying deep ice cores around the world, they have been able to understand and document the changes that are taking place in the earth's atmosphere. The Thompsons have been elected to the National Academy of Sciences in recognition of their significant, original research and achievements. This is one of the few events where they will speak together.

Robert Wittman "The United States vs Art Thieves – True Tales from the FBI's Real Indiana Jones"

Who you gonna call if a priceless piece of artwork is stolen? A good choice might be Robert Wittman, a former FBI agent who has recovered more than \$300 million worth of stolen art during his time as an FBI agent. Called "the most famous art detective in

the world" by the *London Times*, Wittman today is a private security and recovery consultant for clients with irreplaceable cultural assets.

Working with museums, private and public art collections, auction houses and insurance companies, Wittman draws on his unique investigative experience to consult on art matters including expert witness testimony, investigation and collection management. Called a Living Legend by the *Wall Street Journal*, Wittman is an engaging speaker who will pull back the curtain and reveal some of the world's most notorious art thefts and personalities.

Haben Girma
"A Conversation with Haben Girma: The Deafblind Woman Who Conquered Harvard Law."

The first deafblind person to graduate from Harvard Law School, Haben Girma is a human rights lawyer advancing disability justice. President Obama named her a White House Champion of Change. She received the Helen Keller Achievement Award, a spot on the Forbes 30 Under 30 list, and TIME100 Talks. Haben believes disability is an opportunity for innovation, and she teaches organizations the importance of choosing inclusion. The New York Times, Oprah Magazine, and TODAY Show featured her memoir, Haben: The Deafblind Woman Who Conquered Harvard Law.

How long will it take to process my membership?

Online memberships are activated immediately. If joining by check, membership is activated on receipt. The deadline for membership is October 1.
